312.1	Declarations of interest: No					
312.3	Approve minutes of Berden Parish Council from 19 June 2023 Approved and signed.					
312.2	 Public Participation Session with respect to path cutting on this Agenda. Bronwen Rowton spoke for herself and on behalf of several others in the village regarding concerns that most footpaths have not yet been cut this year. She pointed out the dangers from brambles, uneven ground, grass at shoulder level height and unseen rabbit holes and the impact on the enjoyment of walking at this time of year. Some paths are completely inaccessible. Harry, who has taken on the contract from Essex County Council this year, has cut two paths so far and had hoped to have them done by the end of July but is having problems with his mower. A discussion was had as to whether it may be possible to find outside help but this was thought unlikely at this time of year. It was decided that as this mower is not up to the job a heavy-duty mower should be hired w/c 17 July. Pete and Duncan have offered to help Harry. Diane noted that there is no money in the grass cutting budget but if any extra funding is required it could come from reserves or efficiencies in other areas of the budget. 					
312.4	The Clerk's Report was noted and it was agreed that Debbie should write a monthly report for the Parish News magazine.					
312.5	 Solar Farm/Battery Unit Proposals Berden Hall Farm. Protect the Pelhams is waiting to hear if the High Court will grant permission to launch the legal challenge. Low Carbon has launched its own statutory review to challenge their refused permission to build Pelham Spring Solar Farm. Land Between Crabbs Lane and National Grid, Stocking Pelham. Duncan has drafted a joint parish council (Berden, Stocking and Furneux Pelhams) letter to Uttlesford District Council challenging the retrospective request for an Environmental Impact Screening opinion (the application was submitted 7th April 2022). Stocking Pelham Parish Council is happy to sign it, waiting to hear from Furneux Pelham. Berden Parish Council confirmed it is happy for it to be issued. (Letter was emailed to Uttlesford DC and East Herts DC 12.7.23). No news re East End (on the opposite side of the Grid station). 					

312.6 Annual Parish meeting for Parish social groups

- Duncan reported no issues with planning application for a balcony at Park Cottage, Park House Farm.
- Planning application for a cart lodge at 1 Brickhouse End Cottage has been approved.

312.9 Playground

- The RoSPA inspection report was received on 23 June 2023 and showed nothing urgent or for immediate attention.
- Harry has cut back the weeds coming through safety matting and trimmed vegetation in the tunnel.
- Harry asked for clarification on cutting the hedge on the path next to the
 playground and was advised only to cut where branches overhang the path. For
 hedges along the road he should follow the line of the previous contractor. Ray
 Gooding will email a link to an interactive map to Harry which shows who is
 responsible for the various parts of footpaths.

Highways

- Nick was away on holiday but it appears that the verges have been cut.
- Ray Gooding gave an update of the Highways Panel: There is no District Council representation but schemes approved last year are now moving forwards.
- More salt will not be ordered as it was found that the village still has a good supply.

312.14 Uttlesford Community Project Grant

- Kathleen had an encouraging meeting with Sue Hayden from Uttlesford on 10
 July who recommended that the Parish Council apply for a grant towards new
 storage facilities. As the deadline for submissions is 17.7.23 there was
 insufficient time to get quotes for the exterior work to the Village Hall.
 Suggested storage solutions are:
- A double door shed 10ft x 20ft for £1,299 (plus the base) plus a planning application fee of £181
- Eve storage above current storage area to the rear of the hall £1,904
- Anything over £1,000 needs to be match funded.
- Kathleen will submit the form by 17.7 and Diane is available to help with figures.
 Kathleen was thanked. (Post meeting note: the application was sent off on 13 July)
